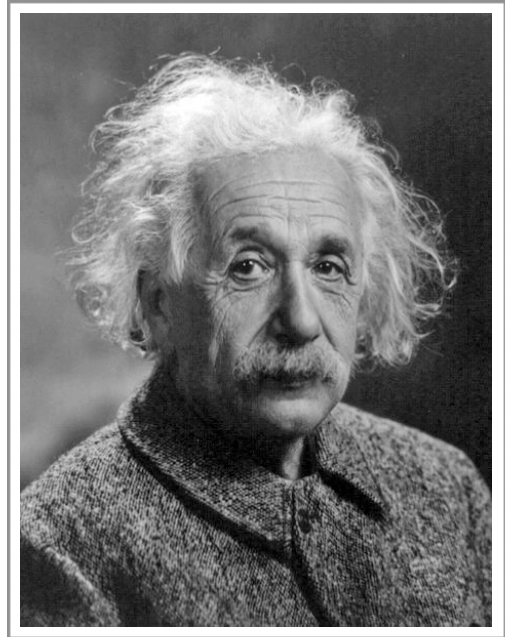


Classic Works Assignment 24

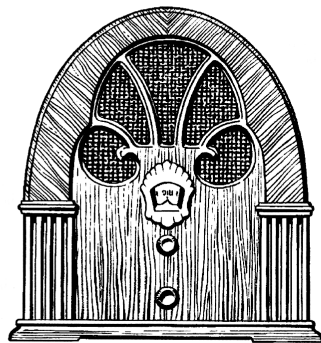
- Memorize **parts 1–2** of John Keats' lovely poem "To Autumn" in your reader.
